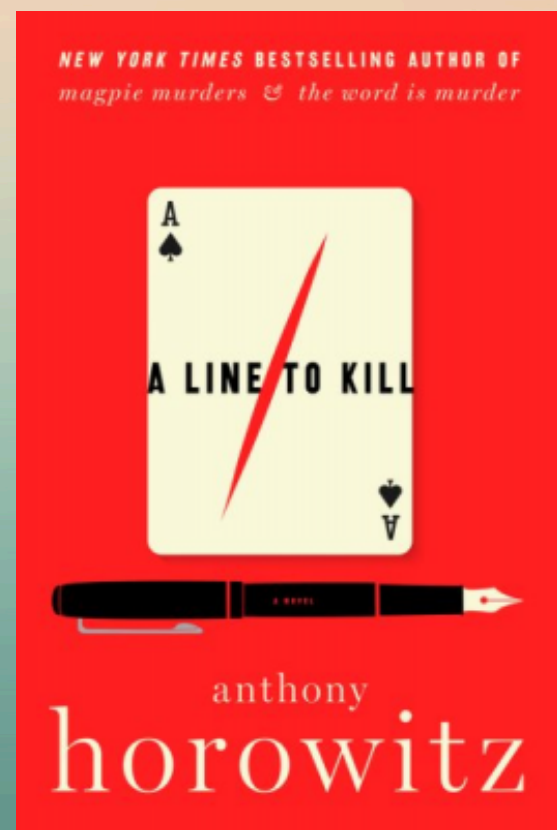
### Must Love Books by Shauna Robinson

### A Line to Kill by Anthony Horowitz

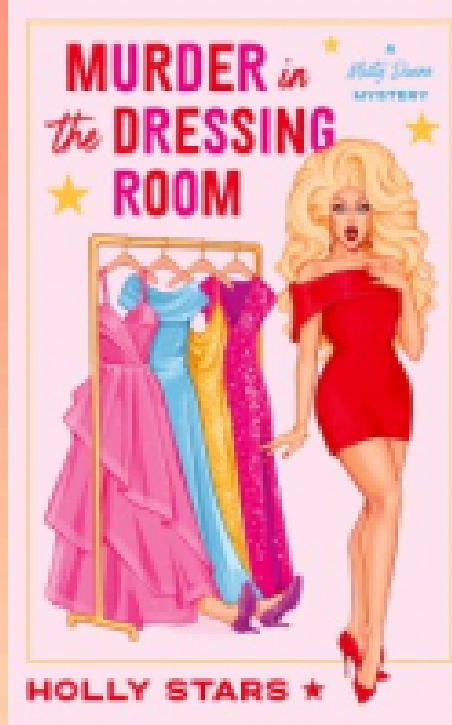

## Murder in the Dressing Room

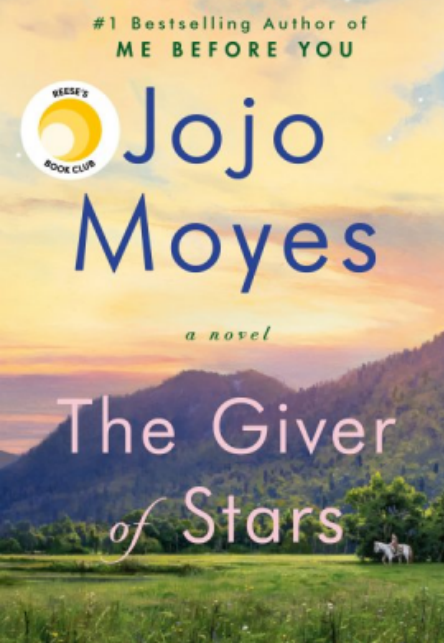

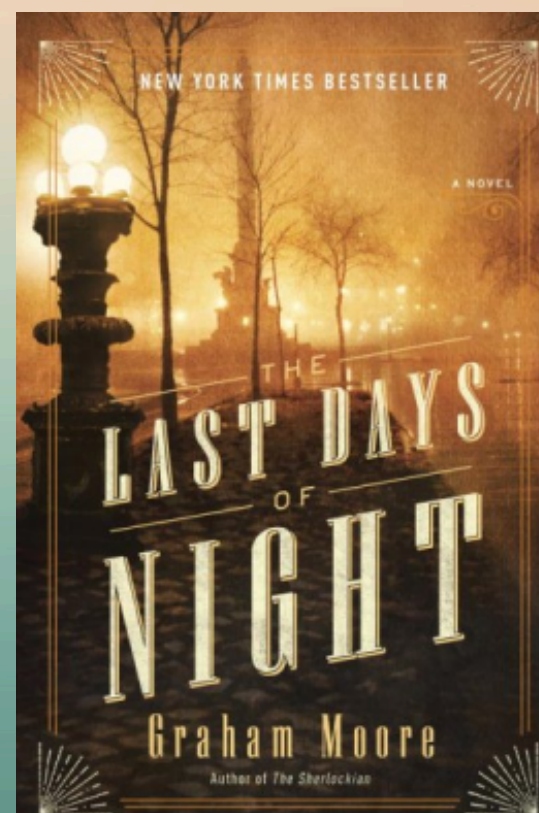
## The Giver of Stars by Jojo Moyes

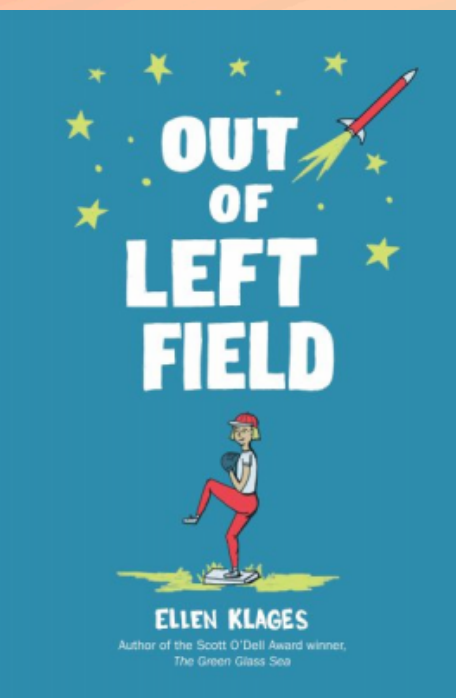
## O Sinners! by Nicole Cuffy
