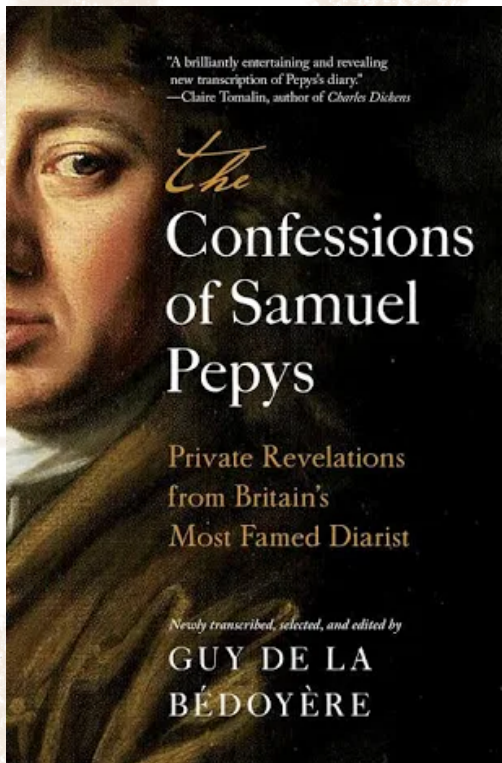


No Pressure Book Group Book List

Confessions of Samuel Pepys

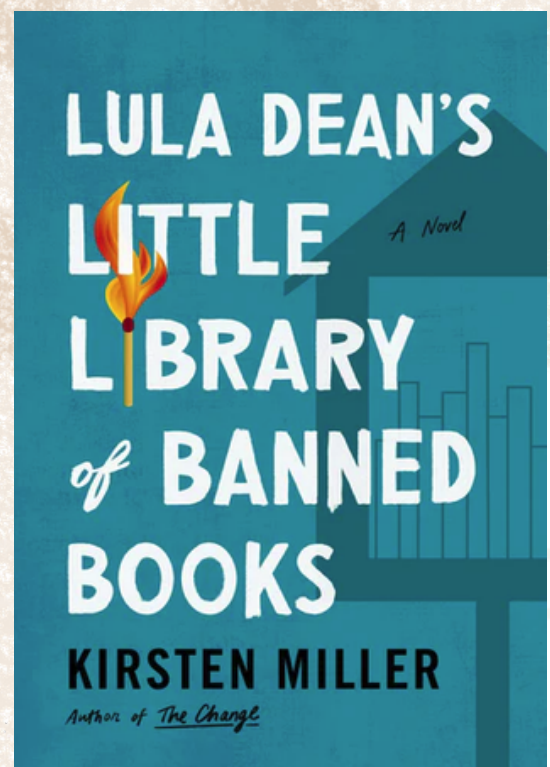
Guy De La Bedoyere

Kirsten Miller

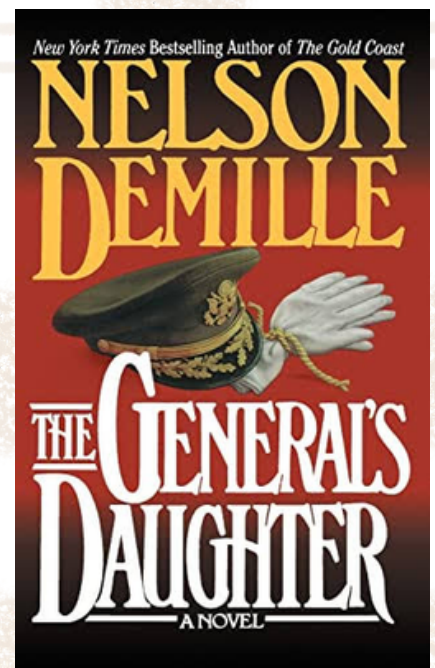
Kirsten Miller writes a humorous morality play that highlights a number of frequently banned books, turning into the catalyst of major life changes for many of the quirky characters in this tale.

Nelson DeMille

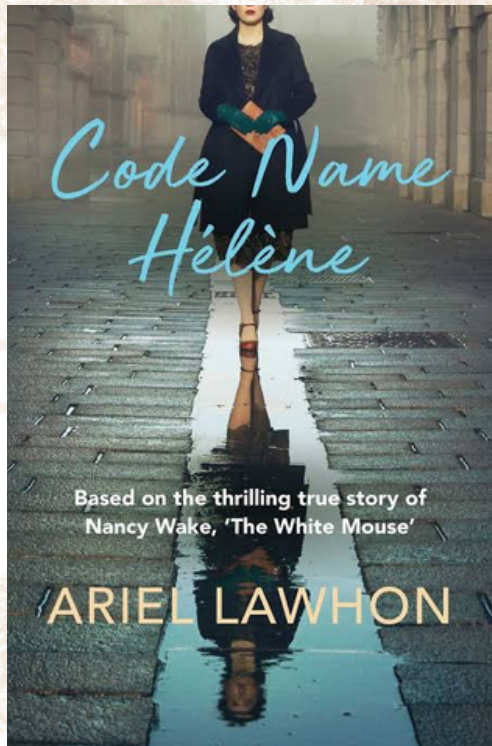
